The Jane Goodall Rose®

- Baptism on the 17th of May 2011

Messenger of Peace of the United Nations, Dr.Jane Goodall has planted and baptized the rose named after her, in the rose garden of Val-de-Marne at Haÿ-Les-Roses, on May 17th 2011.

Christian Hanak, author of roses, and La Roseraie Guillot, breeder of roses, have closely been working together to create a superb variety in honor of this exceptional woman.

This event was hosted by the Val-the-Marne region authorities, and took place in the presence of Dr. Jane Goodall, Christian Hanak and Guillaume Didier (Roseraie Guillot), as well as representatives of the Val-de-Marne Department (Region) and the Jane Goodall Institute.

- Fact Sheet of The Jane Goodall Rose®

A rose is the subject of eight years of work, when you want to create a new variety. The Jane Goodall Rose® is no exception to the rule. It is the delicate marriage of two contemporary flowers issued from former creations.

A rose that had to be adventurous. Eglantine, it should have the strength and determination of a flower open to the sun, dedicated to the extraordinary journey of one who has dedicated her entire life to the cause of the Living, in all its forms: Dr. Jane Goodall.

Finally, it will be the ultimate romantic flower. Painted in a pink pill loan of tenderness, it has the natural grace of simple beauty and delicacy. Its robe is both generous and discrete, we almost would think it is very fragile. Mysterious and refined, it is the flower dedicated to the woman Jane Goodall. It's a rose that knows not to reveal its heart until the end of its flowering, when it can no longer hide its secret. It keeps the mystery of a pink-orange-blooming. Its perfume is intense and powerful. It listens patiently to the nature that surrounds it, its silence is spiritual.

Climbing Generosa, the climbing rose bush has abundant flowering and a vigorous charm. Its dark foliage is robust and very resistant.

Flower: pale rose, flowers bloom in orange trends



- The rose garden of Val-de-Marne

The Rose garden of Val-de-Marne combines a unique natural heritage. The first garden entirely dedicated to roses, it shows the rose in all its diversity to reinterpret the French garden: rose bushes, crawling roses, stem roses, but also rambling roses and climbing along on supports (pergolas, arches, garlands, towers ...) create the volumes and highlight perspectives to adorn the garden.

The Rose garden, which covers three acres, is built around 13 garden collections. This is a unique conservatory of roses: from Asia to America, from antiquity to the present, nearly 3200 varieties are presented to the public.

The Rose garden is a work of sweetness and happiness.

It is not only beautiful, it touches on questions of humanity...

This garden is a real botanical gem:

- **Historically**: Established in 1894, it was the first rose garden to emerge in the world. The garden is included in the inventory of historical monuments.
- **Scientifically**: Its collection of old varieties of roses is among the largest in the world and is a true conservatory, recognized by the French Conservatory of Specialized Vegetal Collections.
- On the **cultural front**: the outdoor theater has received a number of personalities, poets, actors and dancers and still is a site to memorable parties.

A garden that runs through time

Recognized by the Academy of specialized plant collection (CCVS) in 1991 as a national landmark for old roses, the Region has a great responsibility. A worthy successor of Julius Gravereaux, it has to preserve biodiversity and promote the heritage of this rose garden.

- The breeder of The Jane Goodall Rose®

Over 180 years of creation, the unique history of a large house ...

Amongst all the creators who devoted their lives and talents to the Rose, only the GUILLOT family can be proud of having produced six generations of rose breeders whose diverse talents have enabled the establishment of a tradition dating from the early nineteenth century.

Jean-Baptiste Guillot, a.k.a. Guillot Father was born in 1803 in Grenoble and settled in Lyon in 1829. After starting in polyculture, he will be the first, in 1834, to devote his activity to the creation and trading of roses. It is he who will launch the Lyonese tradition of the culture of the rose, dethroning the Paris region who had taken advantage of the protection of the Empress Josephine. His first creation is a bourbon hybrid called "Lamartine" which was published in 1842. The following years many creations will succeed and reach the remarkable number of 81. Amongst these, among the most beautiful old roses some are In 1849 Jean-Baptiste André, a.k.a. Guillot Son, invented the process that will permit him the recognition of rose breeders around the world. In 1884, Jean-Baptiste asked his son Pierre to manage the company. Together they created 16 varieties under the name "Guillot & Sons". Among the 41 varieties created by Peter, some are: Comtesse du Cayla, Mme Léon Painwhich are still grown and encounter big success.

For over several years, the two major guidinglines of the company are:

The redevelopment of Old Roses

With an incomparable heritage of over 650 varieties all grown on the farm and representing all classes of roses, the GUILLOT family is without doubt in the best position to talk about old roses. It was unthinkable not to promote this heritage. After years of research in rose gardens such as those of L'Haÿ-les-Roses, Lyon, or Bagatelle, they reunite all the varieties "maison" still existing, and complete the whole anthology by choosing the best varieties obtained from the seventeenth century, and in 1990 they offer fans a first list of 160 varieties.

The next year will see the release of the first illustrated catalog, devoted to old roses. Research continues and next year new treasures will probably exhume from being forgotten, enrich more and more the collections of amateurs,

The creation of new varieties

Here too, it was inconceivable not to continue the creative work undertaken by Guillot in 1840. Thus Jean-Pierre Guillot and Didier Guillaume create new roses combining the charm and diversity of Old Roses to the qualities of modern roses. They include the "New Old Roses" as the "Rosa Générosa®", Sonia Rykiel®, Paul Bocuse®, Chantal Thomass®, Ladurée® which are a perfect example of this new type of rose.

Christian Hanak is an author of roses. He founded his artistic activity around the "Act Rose", a calligraphic poetry. The sign is its language - a concentration of knowledge and humanity.

He initiates his first rose-event, "a Conversation" dedicated to his art, mixed with the metaphor of the oeuvre of star dancer-choreographer Marie-Claude Pietragalla.

He dedicates his new "Conversation-Rose" to writer Andrée Chedid, and to Academician François CHENG, by combining a poetic counterpoint to a painting of the artist Lassaâd Metoui. A Rose to Rose, a conversation dedicated to the two poets. The creation of two Art Books underscores the whole. These artbooks, numbered to 15 copies, were given to the Bibliothèque Nationale de France, in the presence of the Chairman Mr. Bruno Racine, where they joined the rare book collection.

Hanak is actually writing a metaphor for the rose dedicated to the star dancer/choreographer, Sylvie Guillem, and the composing a metaphor for the rose dedicated to the writer Marguerite Duras in 2014 for the centenary of her birth anniversary.

He also created the Spiritual Rose-Path, for which Jane Goodall has accepted to be the universal Ambassador.

In this context Hanak is developing from autumn 2011 on, the program "roses in Schools", in partnership with the Ministery of Education, to educate children about culture and art of roses. This project proposes the creation of rose gardens in schools and supports the discovery and cultivation of flowers in general.

Dr. Jane Goodall: an exceptional woman

- Biography of Jane Goodall

Born April 3, 1934 in London, Jane Goodall is a primatologist and ethologist.

In 1960, she began her research on the behaviour of chimpanzees in the forests of the Gombe region in Tanzania, where she discovers that they make and use tools to feed themselves.

She obtains her doctorate in ethology in 1965 at the University of Cambridge.

The Jane Goodall Institute is created in 1977. Its mission is to preserve wildlife and fight against the threat of the future of the great apes. Since its creation, the Institute has created innovating programs: Roots & Shoots for the education of the younger, TACARE, to help develop populations' sustainability, and ChimpanZoo, which aims to improve the living conditions of chimpanzees in captivity.

In 1986, Jane Goodall decides to travel the world to raise awareness about the threat to great apes.

In 1995, her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II honors her with the title *Commander of the British Empire*, and some years later Prince Charles names Jane Goodall *Dame of the British Empire*. In April 2002, the Secretary-General Kofi Annan names Dr. Goodall *Messenger of Peace of the United Nations*.

In 2006, the French Prime Minister Dominique de Villepin, honors her with the insignia of **Officier de la Legion d'honneur.**

In the same year she was honoured with the *UNESCO 60th Anniversary Golden Medal*. In 2007, the mayor of the city of Paris honours Jane with the *Grand Medal of the City*.

- Presentation of the Jane Goodall Institute

Founded in 1977, the Jane Goodall Institute continues Dr. Goodall's pioneering research on

chimpanzee behavior started more than 50 years ago—research that transformed scientific

perceptions of the relationship between humans and animals. Today, the Institute is a global leader

in the effort to protect chimpanzees and their habitats. It also is widely recognized for establishing

innovative community-centered conservation and development programs in Africa, and Jane

Goodall's Roots & Shoots, the global environmental and humanitarian program for youth of all

ages, which has groups in more than 120 countries.

> Managing nature reserves

> Managing sanctuaries in Africa to protect our closest relatives
